Before looking forward to everything the new school year will bring, I felt, on behalf of the Governors, that we should celebrate how well White Laith is doing, and in particular, to remember last year's Year 6 who did remarkably well in the SATS tests.

In an independent report their attainment across the whole breadth of the tests was well above the national and Leeds average. In the particular aspect of reading, the report stated this represented achievement in the top 5% of the country.

Obviously, the achievement belongs to the children, but it is good to see that the school focus on a positive learning environment and positive learning behaviours makes such a difference. It also emphasises how all the staff strive every day to enable each child to do and become their best.

Welcome from our SEND and EYFS Governor – Jenny Horton

Hoping that you and your children are now well settled into the new school year. Fresh starts are always exciting, and that is true for governors as well! I have been given the responsibility for Special Educational Needs this year, and it's one that is very close to my heart. Our school has outstanding provision for children with complex learning needs, and I am very much looking forward to being part of this. Fruit/Healthy snacks in KS2

Children in Reception, years 1 and 2 are provided with fruit free of charge.

SCOPE SLEEP RIGHT SERVICE - coffee morning

Does your child have a disability?

Does your child struggle to sleep or stick to a consistent bedtime routine?
The Scope Sleep Right Service is a parent/carer led service which supports children and young people who struggle with sleep.

The service offers short term behavioural intervention followed by group session and/or direct support from an experienced sleep practitioner.

A representative from SCOPE will be in school on Wednesday 18th October 9.00am – 10.00am to host a coffee morning. She will be sharing information about the service and may be able to offer some individual advice.

Please do come along – we are lucky that we are able to host this visitor so it would be great if parents would attend.

Parking – Ravensdale

I have included here the Dojo message I sent this week about parking just in case you missed it.

I received a telephone call on Friday afternoon from the manager of Ravensdale.

She explained that she had received verbal abuse (swearing, aggression) from a number of parents on Friday afternoon when she asked them to move their cars. The cars were either parked in Ravensdale carpark or blocking the carpark entrance.

I was very disappointed to hear that our parents would behave in this manner. Swearing and aggression is unacceptable and I have apologized to her on your behalf.

I have assured her that I would remind parents that the carpark at Ravensdale is PRIVATE and for Ravensdale staff only. She explained that they cannot put a gate on the carpark because they need 24hour emergency access. They do have CCTV and are currently considering whether to introduce clamping although this is something they do not want to have to do.

Please do not park in Ravensdale carpark or park in front of the carpark entrance.

I am aware that parking outside school is limited and when it gets busy this can be unsafe for pedestrians (children and parents). Therefore, please leave the car at home if that is possible or else park and stride.
