Archaeologists are explorers of the past. They find out how people lived long ago. They explore sites, dig up artefacts, look at buildings and read ancient writing to find out about the past.

When they have found artefacts, they record carefully what they have found and look after the artefacts so they are kept for people to look at and learn from.
