1.01	Apology received from PW	JB update the attendance register

	The meeting remained quorate

3.00	Attendance Behaviour & Attitudes	
3.01	AA gave an update to governors regarding the use of Zones Of Regulation (ZOR)	
	in school linking into Mental Health & Wellbeing.	
	AA said that using ZOR has made a big difference for staff across school – helps	
	staff to understand children, childrens understanding of each other and	
	themselves.	
	Progress made but work is still required e.g. recognising size of the problem and	
	which zone is relevant.	
3.01	NS asked if all classes use ZOR as much as AA's.	
	AA explained that there is different use depending upon year groups but	
	definitely sees evidence through displays and language used throughout school.	
	HD recognised that more work on using ZOR is required	
	AA agreed that further discussion at staff meetings would be useful, compare	
	what each class is doing, share experiences to get the most out of it.	
	CJ said that during a visit to Year 2 a child knew about ADHD, had colour card on	
	the table and able to talk about ZOR more than other children.	
3.02	JH asked if restorative conversations were being used / found useful	
	NS said that restorative conversation made it easier for children to reconcile.	
	Example given where two boys were angry with each other and not able to talk	
	but using ZOR enabled the children to understand why they felt that way and	
	how to recognise a change in feelings.	
	It was useful to have resources visible for reference.	
	AA said that no parents have approached her about any football or lunchtime	
	bans therefore wonders if children are understanding more – one child took	
	himself away from a scenario when in the past he would not have done so.	
3.03	JH asked if this links in with 5 ways of wellbeing	
	AA said that the School Council have in assembly & referred to ZOR in a video.	
	HD went on to say that many things that are meant to calm children don't	
	actually help e.g. fiddle toys – a physical touch has proved to be more calming	
	for Year 1 children.	
3.04	JH asked if staff are noting this	
	HD said that this information is included on the child's passport so the next	
	teacher will see it.	
	AA added that the teacher should spot & identify the needs of children,	
	understand why they are acting in that way and then react.	
	HD said that teachers/children need to persist with agreed actions to give time	
	for them to help.
